What courses can I take at Lakeland Community College to meet Cleveland State University's General Education and lower division education requirements?

Cleveland State University's General Education (GenEd) curriculum consists of knowledge and skill components considered to be critical for all University graduates to master in the eight (8) subject-matter areas listed below. As a student at Lakeland Community College, you may choose to take these GenEd courses at Lakeland or at CSU. Please contact a Lakeland advisor for guidance on courses required to receive your associate's degree. LCC choices that most quickly satisfy CSU General Education Requirements FOR THE MIDDLE CHILDHOOD MAJOR are in bold.

(1) English Composition and Writing (6-7 semester hours in composition + WAC hours)

CSU Courses : Corresponding Lakeland Courses:

English 102 **ENGL 1120**

Writing Across the Curriculum (WAC) None: Must be taken through CSU

Transfer students with fewer than 60 transferable hours must take 3 courses. Transfer students with 60-89 transferable hours must take 2 courses. Transfer students with 90 or more transferable hours must take 1 course

(2) Mathematics and Logic (6 semester hours)

CSU Courses : Choose from Corresponding Lakeland Courses:

MTH 127, 128, 129* No Equivalents; must take at CSU

*Student choosing mathematics as one of their middle childhood concentrations will complete MTH 328 & 329 (approved as General Education courses) at CSU and are not required to complete MTH 127, 128 & 129.

(3) Arts/Humanities (9 semester hours from at least 2 different departments)

CSU Courses: Choose 2 Corresponding Lakeland Courses:

Two literature courses** ENGL 2210, 2220, 2230, 2235, 2245, 2248, 2250, 2260,

2275, 2280, 2290, 2296, 2910

CSU Courses: Choose 1 Corresponding Lakeland Course:

One additional 100-200 level ARTS 1120, 2220, 2230, 2240, 2245

course from another area CMPA 1000, 1100

HIST **1100**, **1200**, 2100, 2200, 2400, 2450, 2700,

2910, 2930

Hist 1100 or 1200 may double-count in category 5.

HUMX 1100, 1200, 1300, 2900 MUSC 1200, 1210, 1800, 2200, 2250 PHIL 1300, 1500, **2000**, 2700, 2900,

PHOT 1000

(4) Social Science (9 semester hours from at least 2 different departments)

Required CSU Courses: Corresponding Lakeland Courses:

^{**}Students not choosing Reading & Language Arts as one of the middle childhood concentrations may substitute non-literature courses from category 3.

(5) Western Culture and Civilization (3 semester hours)

<u>CSU Courses</u>: <u>Choose 1 Corresponding Lakeland Course</u>:

HIS 101 or HIS 102 HIST 1100 or 1200

Hist 1100 or 1200 may double-count in category 3.

May double-count in category 3.

(6) Nonwestern Culture and Civilization (3 semester hours)

<u>CSU Courses</u>: <u>Corresponding Lakeland Course</u>:

Approved Arts/Humanities or Social Science PHIL

Course focusing on Nonwestern Culture

and Civilization.*

*Students choosing Social Studies as one of their middle childhood concentrations are required to take PSC 227 and HIS 370 or 393 at CSU, thereby satisfying this general education requirement. There are no LCC equivalents.

HIS 306 or HIS 400 No Equivalent course. Must take through CSU.

PSC 221 or PSC 231 POLS 1350

Science Concentration

No Equivalent courses. Must take through CSU.

Mathematics Concentration

No Equivalent courses. Must take through CSU.

Double-Counting

"Double-counted" courses satisfy two General Education requirements, but the earned semester hours of these courses are not doubled.

CSU Foreign Language Graduation Requirements:

University Requirement for High School Graduates in 1987 or Later:

- The University requires that students pass two (2) years of the same high school foreign language.
- Transfer students may substitute two (2) semesters of the same college-level foreign language for this high school requirement, if they received a C- or higher in both semesters.
- Transfer students who did not complete CSU's foreign language requirement in high school or college must pass two (2) semesters of the same foreign language or take two (2) semesters of American Sign Language and one (1) approved foreign culture course at CSU.

What courses can I take at LCC to satisfy CSU's Professional Education Requirements for Middle Childhood Education?

Portfolio Requirement

†CSU's College of Education and Human Services requires its students to prepare portfolios documenting their growth and achievement in twelve outcomes. At CSU the portfolio process begins in EDB 200, must include a reflective piece or pieces on field experiences or other aspects of the course, and should be organized according to the twelve outcomes so that additional important assignments, in this and other courses, can be incorporated into the evolving portfolio.
