The grid below outlines the major field requirements associated with the degree in Psychology. Please note that equivalencies reflected in this grid are applicable to University Partnership students only. Students completing the degree at CSU's main campus will not be permitted to utilize LCCC's courses in exactly the same manner as illustrated below. Also, please note that a grade of C or higher must be earned in all psychology courses used to fulfill major field requirements.

CAREER INFORMATION FOR PSYCHOLOGY MAJORS

Many employers recognize and appreciate that Psychology majors possess a broad understanding of human behavior, attitudes and feelings. Consequently, the B.A. in Psychology is an attractive degree in many business and institutional settings, particularly where the job requirements involve interpersonal interaction and evaluation. Students who desire to work directly in psychological fields will need to continue their studies in graduate school and acquire an advanced degree (M.A., Ph.D. or Psy.D.). Entrance into graduate programs in Psychology is highly competitive; attractive applicants will have grade point averages of 3.30 or higher and combined GRE scores of at least 1100. Ph.D. clinical programs are particularly selective and will typically require higher grade point averages and GRE scores.
