What courses can I take at Lorain County Community College to meet Cleveland State University's General Education and Urban Affairs requirements?

Cleveland State University's General Education (GenEd) curriculum consists of knowledge and skill components considered to be critical for all University graduates to master in the eight (8) subject-matter areas listed below. As a student at Lorain County Community College, you may choose to take these GenEd courses at LCCC or at CSU. Please contact an LCCC advisor for guidance on courses required to receive your associate's degree.

**Freshman English and Writing Across the Curriculum** – 6 to 7 semester hours in freshman composition plus Writing Across the Curriculum (WAC) courses

**CSU Foreign Language Graduation Requirements**

- The University requires that students pass two (2) years of the same high school foreign language.
- Transfer students may substitute two (2) semesters of one college-level foreign language for this high school requirement. A minimum grade of C- is required in each semester. American Sign Language (ASL) is considered a foreign language.
- Native speakers of a language other than English can be evaluated by the CSU Department of Modern Languages for fluency in writing and speaking.

## What courses can I take at Lorain County Community College to meet lower-division Urban Affairs requirements?

*The Levin College offers three majors – Urban Studies, Public Safety Management, and Urban Services Administration through the University Partnership at LCCC. **CAUTION:** The Levin College requires 36 hours of upper-division (300-400 level) courses. Taking courses at CCC which correspond to some upper-division courses will not reduce the number of upper-division hours required for the degree.*
